### OPENING PRAYER

### CONFESSION

Pastor: We gather before God remembering the cross in sorrow and in shame. We seek His forgiveness, strength, and mercy. We remember the day of our Savior's death. We mourn and struggle to understand the depth of Christ's love---that He should suffer and die in our place. Father, our hearts are heavy as we gather in the name of Christ, bearing witness to the terror of His crucifixion, knowing full well that we are guilty sinners, in need of Your forgiveness, life, and salvation.

People: Go away from me, Lord; for lam sinful.

Pastor: Woe to me, I cried;

People: For I am a person of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips.

Liturgist: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

People: But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Pastor: At times, we have failed to strive against evil in the world.

People: At times, we have denied our Lord.

Pastor: At times, we have betrayed our Lord.

People: Have mercy on us Lord and grant us forgiveness.

(Silence for reflection and examination)

Pastor: Merciful Father,

People: we humbly confess that we are sinful by nature and sinners in thought, word, and deed. We fear standing before You because we know our sin has made us unworthy of You.

But we acknowledge what Your grace has done for us in Jesus Christ, who took the burden of our sin and guilt upon Himself. In His name we confess our sin. By faith, we lay claim to the promise of forgiveness won for us by His sacrifice on the cross.

Pastor: And then the Lord touched me with his grace;

People: your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.

### RESPONSIVE READING

from Isaiah 53

Pastor: Who has believed what they heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?


