From Pastor Rich to the Members and Friends of Grace,

Well who could have thought that this virus, this COVID-19, would keep us away from worshipping together in our church home? "Pastor, when are we going to get back together? Where is our faith!" Or is it, "Pastor, are we going to be that church that selfishly ignores Knox County's recommendations, comes back together and sparks a new wave of infections!"

Believe me I hear both reactions and I believe in the validity of both. There have been times in the Bible and church history where true believers could not publicly gather together to worship God. Faith did not disappear in people as they hid in catacombs or established secret house churches. But there have also been times when people braved meeting together come what may.

We are not under persecution and our government is not attacking our faith. Still, I am frustrated at the current situation.
