## Key Scripture

Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh. And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed. Genesis 2:24-25

#### **Key Points**

• Secrecy is the enemy of intimacy.

- What could you do to eliminate temptation before it happens?

Jesus, thank You for being the perfect sacrifice for our sins. Holy Spirit, give us the strength we need to resist temptation. Show us the sin we need to cut out of our lives with only Your help so we can be children of the light. Amen!
