# Will You Make 50 Years?

ecently two famous billionaire couples had a breakup of their marriages. Jeff Bezos, of Amazon fame, and Mackenzie Bezos were married in 1993, had four children and were married for 26 years. Jeff Bezos currently ranks as the richest person in the world, despite his divorce. Reportedly he has a net worth of more than \$200 billion. Obviously it was not money problems that caused their breakup.

Bill Gates, of Microsoft fame, and Melinda Gates married in 1994 and had three children. They were married for 27 years. Currently Gates is the 4<sup>th</sup> richest person in the world at something like \$144 billion net worth. Financial issues again were not the culprit in dividing them.

Money issues may make one of the top five issues that bring on divorce but it is nowhere near the top. The number one issue leading to divorce is a lack of commitment. Six percent of marriages will make it to their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Of course, this takes in the fact that a spouse may die before they reach that anniversary. The *average* marriage in America lasts 8 years.

The way the Bible describes marriage greatly differentiates from what we see across the American landscape. Our culture emphasizes feelings/romance over commitment/covenant. The Bible's take on marriage in Ephesians 5:22-33 is so countercultural that it is offensive to modern ears. Wives submitting to their husbands as to the Lord are likened to the church submitting to Christ. And husbands loving their wives as they love their own bodies are likened to Christ loving the church and sacrificing Himself for it.

The Christian marriage then is to be characterized by commitment, sacrifice and self-lessness. The joy of marriage is that you have someone who is for you and on your team. No one and nothing comes before your spouse. You are to be mutually submissive to one another. Self-centeredness is marital cancer and is to be fought against. We are to love one another, forgive one another, and serve one another as Jesus has done for us.

Every marriage has its ups and downs. Frankly there are times when you may hate your spouse. People married 50 years and longer have told me that they had times when they were extremely angry at their spouse and their marriage was on shaky ground. But the Holy Spirit empowers us to love and forgive and that is what happened to these couples as love flourished once again.

In my own marital counseling I have seen that the first year of marriage (regardless of whether they had been living together for some years) is the most vulnerable to breakup. If they would stay together for five more years things generally improved greatly. Couples who have put their children as a priority instead of their spouses are also vulnerable to divorce.

Jeff Bezos and Bill Gates were self-centered and therefore unfaithful. Neither of them submits to Christ. They live for themselves and follow their feelings. Marriage for them so many others is about meeting their needs.

For us, who are in Christ, God has given us in marriage, a helper and a friend. What makes marriage great and lasting is that we have a best friend in our spouse and an even greater and mutual friend in Jesus Christ.

Will you make 50 years? I hope so! Keep your spouse as a priority and keep on serving one another and imitate Jesus, and I guarantee your marriage will flourish.

## Good Stewards for our Good Shepherd

#### The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. -Psalm 23:1 (ESV)

Psalm 23 portrays God as our Good Shepherd in a moving illustration of how He protects and cares for His flock in this life and for eternity. The text of this well-known and loved passage serves as the foundation for countless sermons, studies, prayers and memorial services. It is regarded as a Christian favorite for the comfort and hope it brings, and many reading this article may be able to recite it from memory. But why stop there?

#### The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it... -Psalm 24:1 (NIV)

David's next Psalm begins with a verse simple in its straightforwardness, yet more complex in its application, and certainly worthy of our reflection. God is acknowledged as the sovereign Creator, holding authority over His entire creation. The Genesis account reveals much about mankind which still holds true for us today: male and female were created in God's own image, Adam was instructed to work and provide order by taking care of the land and naming the animals, and Adam and Eve were commanded to be fruitful and multiply to fill the earth and subdue it. Psalm 24:1 both confirms that all Creation belongs to God and reinforces that our role is not 'owner', but remains as a 'steward', or a person appointed or employed to look after, provide order, manage and care for another's property. Understanding this concept of Biblical Stewardship and maintaining this perspective is central to who we are and what we've been called to accomplish in life and ministry.

#### Connect. Grow. Serve. - Grace Lutheran Church Mission Statement

Like Psalm 24:1, this statement is seemingly direct, and has become part of our culture through weekly affirmation during worship. Yet as with all relational concepts, executing our mission well can become difficult when we dig deeper into the detailed "hows" of living out our roles as members of our congregation, our community, and the larger Christian Church. We often struggle when faced with situations where we must humbly admit our lack of control: when we feel overwhelmed by limited time or energy to complete our demanding to-do lists; when we lack clarity as to our 'purpose' or 'calling' in our personal life or career; when we lose or lack what we consider 'our' possessions or financial assets. By refocusing our perspective to align with Biblical Stewardship, we are reminded that God is in control, and we take comfort in knowing we can call on Him for guidance, direction, and strength to carry out the work He would have us do for His glory.



# Supplements Fight COVID-19 Cheap Drug Cuts COVID Death Risk by 80 Percent

study that was published in the journal, "Nutrition," found that supplements including vitamins C and D are a safe, effective, and economical means of keeping COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases at bay. Zinc and DHA (docosahexaenoic acid), an omega-3 fatty acid, are also important. Adrian Gombart of the Linus Pauling Institute stated that the problem is simply that people are not getting enough of these nutrients. This could ultimately destroy an individual's resistance to infections. He urged taking a daily multivitamin along with at least 200 additional milligrams of vitamin C, and a total of 2,000 IU of vitamin D.

A recent study from Liverpool University found that Ivermectin, an inexpensive drug that treats head lice, reduces the risk of dying from COVID-19 by 80 percent in hospitalized patients. Only 8 out of 573 patients treated with Ivermectin died, as opposed to 44 out of 510 patients who took a placebo. An earlier study found that Ivermectin, which is a prescription antiparasitic drug that can cost less than \$20, eliminated all of the virus from the body within 48 hours of taking a single dose. The research is currently awaiting peer review before being published. However, there are currently many physicians who are prescribing Ivermectin for the treatment of COVID-19.

### The Same Mighty Power

eople sometimes said I just had to go with them to a special rally because the speaker was really on fire and so full of the Holy Spirit.

See, though, what St. Paul wrote about God at work in us. "I pray that the perception of your mind may be enlightened so you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the glorious riches of His inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power to (toward, in) us who believe, according to the working of His vast strength. He demonstrated this power in the Messiah by raising Him from the dead and seating Him at His right hand in the heavens." (Ephesians 1:18-20, see also Ephesians 3:20.)

Who is it that was involved in raising Jesus from the dead and is also at work in us who believe? "...concerning His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who was a descendant of David according to the flesh and who has been declared to be the powerful Son of God by the resurrection from the dead according to the Spirit of holiness." "Spirit of holiness" is an expression meaning "Holy Spirit." (Bauer, Arndt & Gingrich, <u>A Greek-English Lexicon...</u>, 'αγιωσυνη. Quotation: Romans 1:3 -4) The mighty power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit and He is also at work in you with that same mighty power!

At about this point we ask where are the visible manifestations of that power. We do not see miracles or healings. But, consider for a moment what the New Testament says about what we are and what the Spirit does in us.

"Now the works of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, moral impurity, promiscuity, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambitions, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and anything similar. I tell you about these things in advance—as I told you before—that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God." (Galatians 5:19-21) Have any of these things ever gotten you into trouble and caused you regret? Have you ever wished one or more of these were not so apparent in your life?

The Spirit of God shows Himself in us through quiet things that make us different. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faith, gentleness, self-control." (Galatians 5:22-23) Have you ever wished for more of any of these? Have you ever been hurt because you had too much of any one of these?

Often God's Spirit is at work in us doing quiet things that are big changes in us. A man I knew said he used to be quick to punch anyone who got in his way. But, he began worshiping in church every week and others noticed a change in him. God's Spirit was changing him from the inside, and others noticed.


#### Middle School Summer Serve—June 9-11, 2021
