# We Need Each Other!

et me start with these quotes from Christian leaders of long ago:

He cannot have God for his father who does not have the church for his mother. -- Augustine

Apart from the church, salvation is impossible. -- Martin Luther

So highly does the Lord esteem the communion of His church, that He considers everyone a traitor and apostate from religion who perversely withdraws himself from any Christian society which preserves the true ministry of the word and sacraments. -- John Calvin

For where two or three come together in my name, there I am with them. -- Jesus

It certainly goes against the spirit of this age to think that we need others if we are to be close to God. A neighbor of mine once told me, that they were very spiritual and had worked out their own way to commune with God.

- This doesn't work for me.
- I have developed my own idea of right and wrong.
- As long as I don't hurt anyone, I think I'm free to do whatever I want.
- The church is full of hypocrites. All they want is your money and to see how many people they can cram into their buildings.
- Look at all the scandals with ministers and priests. Why should we listen to them?

Let's go back to the Bible and, particularly, the book of Acts. It is Jesus Christ who created the church. Throughout the New Testament the Word of God is telling us that we cannot just have a relationship with God and ignore the people around us. In fact, the Bible insists that we need each other. The word independent (as many churches like to use in their name) is antithetical to God's purposes. The favorite analogy of the Bible is the body. Can the eyes or ears say they want to be independent from the body? Absurd! We need each other and God has made it so!

Many will come right back and say: "Look at all the damage churches have done to people." It is true that all churches are imperfect and that some are very imperfect. The church is like Noah's Ark: The stench inside would



be unbearable if it weren't for the storm outside. Yet, it is only in the Christian church that the truth is being proclaimed and portrayed.

When one becomes a Christian receiving the grace of God through Jesus Christ, one is made part of the Holy Christian church. This is the universal or catholic (with a small "c") church which is invisible. All true Christians belong to this universal church. But it is clearly God's will and intention (indeed His command) that we be a part of a local church – a local assembly of believers. It is in these local churches that God intends to carry out His mission to reconcile all humanity to Himself. If you are not a part of a local church then you have not made yourself available to God's mission; God is not working through you!

We were forced to separate ourselves for a time from our church family in an effort to stay healthy and safe. While we are thankful for the technology that allowed us to stay somewhat connected via on-line services, it also had some negative impacts and created new habits for some that cannot replace the one-on-one, face-to-face relationships we have with the members of our church family. fully, the worst of the pandemic is now behind us.

If you have not re-joined us for regular Sunday in-person worship—WE WANT YOU BACK! WE NEED YOU BACK! So please stop thinking you can go it alone. Reevaluate your present absence from the body of Christians God has placed you in. Do not take lightly your commitment to Christ and your commitment to your church. The truth is we need one another!





## Gospel Ministry Versus Social Ministry

y classmates and I were all training to become pastors. A frequent question among the students was how to balance preaching the Gospel with doing good for all people. The first concerns our relationship with God, or the vertical. The second concerns our care for other human beings in the name of God, or the horizontal.

A clever sounding admonition said, "Do not become so heavenly minded that you are no earthly good." At the time there was a famous Lutheran clergyman who often mentioned the Kingdom of God, but in a way that left many uneasy. When Jesus came announcing the Kingdom of God, He called people to repent of their sins and to believe on Him (the vertical). When I once had the opportunity to hear this clergyman, he directly said the Kingdom of God was not some pie in the sky in the sweet by and by after you die, but much more akin to social concerns now (the horizontal). He could rightly point to Jesus healing the sick and feeding the hungry, etc.

Many years later I heard a man tell about his first years as a new missionary. The tribal group to whom he had been sent had many problems with deadly diseases and infant mortality. He wanted to preach the Gospel, but he spent his first two years building a hospital. In the end that hospital established his credentials with those people and they listened eagerly when he preached the Gospel to them. To this day he firmly believes he would not have been able to peach the Gospel to these people without that hospital.

A man named Brother Andrew wrote a book called "God's Smuggler" about covertly bringing Bibles into Communist lands. In an interview he proposed his program for social ministry. Based on passages like, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and the other things shall be added to you." (Matthew 6:33) he urged preaching the Gospel and spreading God's Word as of first importance. God promises to supply the needs of His people. If we preach the Gospel, people will come to believe in Jesus, and God will keep His promises to provide all they need.

We feel good about ourselves when we hand money to the beggar along our way. But, community groups in Portland, Oregon asked people to stop doing that. Too often the beggars are simply enabled to continue bad life choices. These groups asked instead that donations be given to organizations prepared to screen those receiving aid and to help them learn to make better life choices so they can have a better future on their own.

In Acts 6 the Apostles appointed deacons to handle needs for aid so that the preaching of God's Word would not be neglected. Giving the right balance between both the vertical and the horizontal will never be easy for us and may be decided differently in different situations.

### Control Body Weight with Tea

study from the University of Tsukuba in Japan stated that drinking oolong tea may help you lose weight while you sleep. According to the study, oolong tea is partially oxidized when it is processed and has characteristics of both green and black teas. Researcher Kumpei Tokuyama said that "oolong tea is like all teas in that it contains caffeine, which impacts energy metabolism by increasing your heart rate. However, studies suggest that tea consumption may also increase the breakdown of fat, independent of the effects of caffeine." When tested on healthy volunteers, researchers found that oolong tea increased the breakdown of fat by about 20 percent compared with a placebo (an unmedicated preparation) and continued to have an effect during sleep. Because there was no difference in sleep patterns between the two groups, researchers believe the caffeine in oolong tea does not keep people up at night. Researcher Tokuyama also said that "the stimulatory effects of oolong tea on fat breakdown during sleep could have real clinical relevance for controlling body weight.
