#### Monthly Ministry Focus


#### **Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund**

This month's ministry focus is *The Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund*. The Endowment Fund is a permanent fund established in January 2017 to support two activities: The Elseroad Scholarship Fund and New Ministries. The vision of the fund is to reach the ultimate goal of expanding the Kingdom of God by supporting new ministries that *CONNECT* people to Christ, granting scholarships to *GROW* Pastors and Christian leaders, and providing opportunities for Christians to *SERVE*.

In the 2023-2024 school year, the Elseroad Scholarship Fund is supporting two gentlemen studying for the Pastoral Ministry at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis with scholarships totaling \$18,000. Garrett Anklam is in his second year of seminary, and is a member of a church in our District; and James Doebler is in his final year of seminary. The fund has also supported our own Grace member, Daniel Bueckman, through his first three years of seminary. Daniel is currently on his vicarage this year and receiving support from his vicarage

congregation. He can apply again for support from the Scholarship Fund in his final seminary year. To date, the Elseroad Scholarship Fund has supported Pastoral and Concordia students with more than \$80,000 in scholarships, and two of those students were confirmed at Grace Lutheran Church!

You were probably already familiar with the Elseroad Scholarship Fund, but did you know that the Endowment Fund also supports New Ministries with "seed money" to help start new ministries at Grace Lutheran Church or within other recognized arms of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod? Eligible ministries are organized, sustained efforts or initiatives to advance, promote, or serve the Gospel of Jesus Christ that are different in concept or approach from current ministries. In 2022, two grants were given for new ministries at Grace: *"Cancer Companions"* and *"Bibles for the Incarcerated"*. If God has been tugging on your heart to start a new ministry, The Endowment Fund is here to support you! The grant application is available



at <u>https://www.visitgrace.org/</u> endowment/.

To date, more than \$420,000 has been contributed to the Endowment Fund, and those monies are independent of Grace Lutheran Church daily operations. The Endowment Fund has its own Bylaws and Guiding Principles, independent of the Grace Lutheran Church governance, to ensure the Fund is used only for the purposes described above. The Administration Team prudently invests the Fund assets for dividend yield to support the Scholarship and New Ministry disbursements. The Scholarship

and New Ministry Teams review the applications in their respective area and determine recipients of the funds.

You can also be a part of this ministry supporting church leaders through your financial giving. If you designate your gift as "*Grace Endowment/Unrestricted*" the earnings from your gift will be used for scholarships and new ministry. This allows the endowment teams flexibility as they make their decisions during the grant application

process. If you prefer, you can designate your gift for *"Grace Endowment/Scholarship"* or *"Grace Endowment/New Ministry"*. These gifts will be restricted per your designation, and the earnings will be used accordingly. Regardless of designation, the fund's administration will consider your designation as permanent and administer the earnings accordingly.



#### **Ultra-Processed Foods Linked to Dementia and Cancer**

A ccording to a study published in the journal "*Neurology*," people who eat the most ultra-processed foods, such as soft drinks, chips, and cookies, have a higher risk of developing dementia. Researchers found that every 10 percent daily increase in ultra-processed foods increased the risk of dementia by 25 percent. Study author, Huiping Li, Ph.D., of Tainjin Medical University said, "*Ultra-processed foods are meant to be convenient and tasty, but they diminish the quality of a person's diet. These foods may also contain food additives, such as xanthum gum and guar gum or molecules from packaging or molecules produced during heating, all of which have been shown in other studies to have negative effects on thinking and memory skills.*" This same study also found that replacing 10 percent of the ultra-processed foods with unprocessed or minimally processed foods, such as fresh fruit and vegetables, reduced the risk of dementia by 19 percent. In another study, researchers at Imperial College London found that the more ultra-processed foods you eat, the higher your risk for developing cancer, especially ovarian and breast cancers. They added packaged breads, most breakfast cereals, foods high in salt, fat, sugar, and artificial additives to the list of ultra-processed foods. This study of 200,000 middle-aged adults found similar results: For every 10 percent increase in ultra-processed foods in a person's diet, the risk of dying from breast cancer rose by 30 percent.
