Grace Lutheran Disaster Response

PSALMS 72:12-13— For He will deliver the needy who cry out, the afflicted who have no one to help, 13 He will take pity on the weak....

n the aftermath of a natural disaster we watch our TVs and witness the destruction and tragedy as homes are destroyed, lives lost, and landscapes ruined. Many of the afflicted reflect immediate grief and shock from not

knowing where friends and relatives are, whether they are alive or not, and finally an expression of faith and hope in God is voiced.

Back in 2005, I was privileged to serve with many other Christians of many denominations in the reconstruction process after Hurricane Katrina. After seeing the massive destruction and participating in the rebuilding efforts, I was left with a lasting impression to help those devastated by such disasters. The reality of this came through the tears of a young downsyndrome lady as our team took her on a tour of her reconditioned home. The last time she had seen the home it was under 11 feet of water and nearly all of its contents were destroyed. God's grace

was given to her through the hands, feet and skills of many, and I was one of those. It was this experience that led me to suggest a disaster response ministry at Grace. Grace is filled with many willing servants, and I thought that a ministry organized for this purpose would receive great support.


This new ministry idea was first discussed with Pastors Elseroad and Anderson back in July 2022, and the idea

was quickly and enthusiastically embraced by them. After this meeting, Sam Jones and I were appointed to Co-Chair the planning committee.

The first actions were to seek a national affiliation, recruit volunteers, purchase a trailer, and then tools and supplies. At the Annual Voters Meeting in December 2022 the congregation approved the recommendation to form:

By the end of June we purchased some tools and a trailer:

Trailer costs including signage (a member donation) - \$11,500.

Initial tool purchase - \$8,700

This gave the ministry the training, some tools and a trailer to begin functioning as a viable group of servants. One should note that all of our participating members have donated use of personal tools, money, and transportation. These gifts are in addition to the seed money provided through the budget.

The following services were provided over the past four months. They were:

- A Grace member's property after a wild fire 85 Hours expended
- F2 disaster recovery for 5 Grace members 255 Hours expended
- Mayfield, KY Hope Initiative F4 recovery 700 Hours expended

These hours include travel, work and stay over when required. The total number of Grace LDR members participating was 19, and some of these gave up vacation and personal leave time as they were away from work and family. Thanks be to God for their willingness to serve Him and others in need during disasters. In addition, there were three members of Sheppard of the Hills from Crossville serving with us, and they have requested to serve with us during future deployments.

As we look forward to 2024 and beyond, we are basically prepared and ready to serve after a disaster within our district and general area. It is not known how many deployments will occur, as natural disasters happen at unknown times. We will require some additional equipment and will travel to unknown destinations. Thank you Grace Church for your support of this new serving ministry, serving those in need, as the Holy Spirit moves all of us to care for those afflicted by showing them mercy through Jesus Christ.

I close with this invitation, that you too can be a part of this ministry by volunteering to serve, *God does and will* continue to help those that are afflicted. Through us his love is shared and hope is delivered! We show we are Christians by our love!

What is VIA de CRISTO? It is a Spanish phrase meaning "Way of Christ." VIA de CRISTO is a method of living your Christian faith as a life style. It begins with a structured three-day weekend designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christian people and bring them to a new awareness of living in God's grace. It is a combined effort of lay people and clergy toward renewal of the church. VIA de CRISTO is the Lutheran expression of other three-day Cursillo based movements. However, VIA de CRISTO is inter-denominational and welcomes any and all Christians to attend. This is an international movement through all walks of life.

In the Beginning Was the Word

e read, "In the beginning was the Word..." and probably do not suspect all that is behind it. In summary, it is personified and refers to the creative intelligence that made and sustains the universe. As you continue reading John 1 you learn this creative intelligence Who always existed, always was took on flesh and became our Redeemer. Our Creator is also our Redeemer, is Jesus. The Word was a concept familiar to both Jews and Greeks, even if slightly different in the understanding of both. Because Word was familiar to both groups, John's Gospel could better find an audience with both.

"Word" translates 'Logos.' While "Word" is an accurate literal translation, it also misses so much more that is a part of 'Logos.' "Logos" is more than a vocable, like "tree" or "love" or "day." As Greeks like Aristotle understood the 'Logos,' it referred to ordered discourse that is part of a carefully argued presentation. For the Stoics it came to be the divine reasoning that put the universe in order. "In Greek thought, the logos was the rational principle guiding the universe and making life coherent."*

Philo was an educated Jew and a philosopher from Alexandria born about twenty years before Jesus and dying about forty years after Jesus' ministry on earth. He was acquainted with Stoicism and easily connected it with God's Wisdom in the creation of all things when He called all things into being by the power of His spoken Word. "For Jewish people, the Logos was the word of the Lord, an expression of God's wisdom and creative power. By Jesus' time, the Logos was viewed as coming from God and having His personality (see Ps 33:6, 9; Prov 8:22-31); John affirmed this understanding (John 1:14)."*

In John 1:3 we read that all created things were made through the 'Logos.' That is repeated in verse 10. Verses 11 and 12 identify the One Who created as the One Who also redeems and gives authority to be children of God. (John uses the word "son" for Jesus, but "children" for us.) Yet, many do not recognize Him and do not receive Him or what He offers.

This One Who created and redeems became flesh and identified with those whom He created. In our English Bibles we read that He dwelt among us. The verb used means to pitch a tent. The Old Testament usage of that verb is important. In the Greek Septuagint (Old Testament) known to most by virtue of the conquests of Alexander the Great that spread the Greek language across the empire that word refers to the Tabernacle, or Tent of Meeting where God, Himself came to be present with His people. Jesus is the presence of God among us. He is the Word.

Common Artificial Sweetener Linked to Heart Attack and Stroke

rythritol, a popular artificial sweetener used in low-calorie, low-carb and "keto" products increases the risk of heart attack and stroke. In a study of more than 4,000 men and women, researchers at the Cleveland Clinic found those with higher blood levels of the artificial sweetener Erythritol were at increased risk of a major cardiac event. Their research determined that Erythritol made it easier for cell fragments to clump together and form clots. Senior author Stanley Hazen, M.D., Ph.D., said "Our study shows that when participants consumed an artificially sweetened beverage with an amount of Erythritol found in many processed foods, markedly elevated levels of Erythritol in the blood are observed for days and these levels are well above those enhance clotting risks." Studies have shown that many artificial sweeteners are combined with Erythritol to enhance the flavor of many processed foods.
