Meet Matthew McCarthy Director of Christian Education (DCE) Intern

If you have not met me yet, my name is Matthew McCarthy, and I am the DCE intern at Grace Lutheran Church. The main mission of a DCE is to equip families in the Body of Christ for spiritual maturity, service, and witness in home, job, congregation, community, and the world. In practical terms, I will be working with Grace's middle school and high school students to develop lifelong followers of Christ. On Sundays, you can find me connecting and

loving our students during 9:30 a.m. Sunday school.

I grew up in East Texas in the city of Tyler. I was the first born of three, and I have a sister in college at Dallas Baptist University, and a brother in high school. My two parents were lifelong Lutherans and were both deeply involved in my home church. My mother played keyboard in our praise team, and my father filled the role of a children's director. Growing up I attended every Sunday service, meeting, and event my church hosted. I developed a familiarity with the church that grew

into a deep love and for God and my faith. I became deeply involved with Trinity's youth group, and after a few years of mentorship and lots of undeserved grace, my DCE convinced me to attend an event at Concordia Austin called MYR. MYR, or Missional Youth Retreat, is an event intended to encourage high school students to think through their calling and a career in ministry. I went to this event three times and can trace a portion of my passion for ministry and my love for Concordia Austin to this retreat. I was set on DCE ministry by the time I graduated high school and attended Concordia Austin right after graduation in the fall of 2019.

Once I arrived at Concordia, I attempted to get connected with their student ministry. I began to serve by running tech for the on-campus, student-led ministry known as the Refuge. After a few months I developed the courage to give the message one week, which led to me being pulled in as the next speaking coordinator for the Refuge. I served in this volunteer role for three years and began to learn what it meant to be in ministry.

In my Freshman year I met Kyra, who I married this past June. My time at Concordia had its fair share of adversity, having Covid start my second semester, and tension with the Synod my senior year. Through it all, I had a great time at Concordia and learned many invaluable lessons.

While I am not sure what the future holds for me in terms of career, I do know that my calling is to ministry and the spreading of the Gospel. On top of staying a DCE, I have considered pursuing seminary and pastoral office, as well as entering the academic world to become a professor. I deeply enjoy the subjects of theology

and philosophy and would love to be able to engage in theological discourse as a career.

In my free time I enjoy reading, playing table-top games with friends, and my ongoing pursuit to learn both guitar and bass guitar. I am excited for my time to serve Grace Lutheran Church and would love to thank the church for how open and welcoming it has been to my wife and me. I look forward to what God has in store for us!

Dr. John Chesnut, President/CEO of Wycliffe Bible Translators USA, writes:

We thank the Lord for Tom and Juanita and their significant contribution to the work of Bible Translation.

Tom and Juanita followed the Lord's leading in attending Wycliffe Quest in 1987, and linguistic training at TXSIL in 1989-90. They were assigned to the Tanzania Group and the Zinza translation program in 1991. Tom established translation training for Tanzanians using their national language of Swahili. God gave Juanita the desire of her heart to teach middle school at West Nairobi School in Nairobi from 1999-2020. Tom completed a Master's degree in check draft Scriptures and mentor translation teams, working as a Wycliffe volunteer. He also served as Chair of the Executive Committee of the Uganda-Tanzania Branch from 2013-18.

As most of you know, Tom is facing some very serious health issues. Tom and Juanita have been faithful servants of God's kingdom. Daily Glass of Wine Slashes Dementia

new double-blind, placebo-controlled study at Georgetown University Medical School found that Resveratrol, a compound in red wine, has been shown to stop the progression of a biomarker associated with Alzheimer's disease. Investigators gave people with mild to moderate Alzheimer's either a highly purified form of Resveratrol in varying dosages or a placebo for one year. Those who received increasing dosages of the compound (up to a gram twice daily) showed no change in blood levels of Amyloid-beta 40 (a protein linked to Alzheimer's). Levels rose in those taking a placebo. In another study published in the British Medical Journal, it was found that drinking a daily glass of wine can halve the risk of developing dementia in the future. In addition, French researchers found that teetotalers during middle age had a 47 percent increased risk of developing dementia compared with those who drank from one to the weekly limit of 14 units (four ounces or 1/2 glass). The researchers also suggested that moderate amounts of alcohol lowered the risk of a heart attack and stroke.
