he *Holy Smoker* Ministry has been busy outlining its plans for the 2024 calendar year.

Our first event will be a presentation and training by *Dr. Lyda Garcia* on *March 2 from 12:00—6:00* 

p.m. A dinner will follow the training. We invite our congregation to come out and hear Dr. Garcia speak to Grace members and the community on "Meat Quality and Barbecue". This event is open to our entire Grace family, plus a couple of other churches are being invited. Dr. Garcia holds a PhD in Meat Science from Texas A&M University and leads a nationally-competitive meat judging team. (Lvda G. Garcia | ANSCI (osu.edu) Tickets are \$20 per family, and we ask you to bring a covered dish. We will prepare the meat for dinner during the training. We would like to have 50-100 people in attendance. This is the tenth year of ministry for the Holy Smokers, and our mission statement has two parts:

- 1. We spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout our church and our community by preparing and serving a quality meal of smoked meats.
- We promote the spiritual health and well-being of our ministry members through devotions and fellowship.

<u>Membership</u>—The Holy Smokers is a men's ministry of Grace Lutheran Church members. There are no specific qualifications or skills required to join the Holy Smokers. Our group is open to men ages 16-90.

Brian Strobel is our Lead Smoker, and took over for our Founder Bruce Collet. Our Board is comprised of Dave Ishee, Jack McGee, Harvey Booher, Phil Bohlken, and Don Thaemert. Our other teammates include: Scott Zimmer-

man, Craig Schmitt, Craig Emerson, Steve Peterson, Bruce Collet, Sam Jones, Charlie Stine, and Dennis Laneman. Our newest member is Matthew McCarthy, our new DCE Intern who recently joined our ranks! There's a heavy Texas and former military presence in our group.

Phil Bohlken and Bruce Collet led the redesign of the smoker starting in October 2022, and finished last spring. It really is a thing of beauty to see. We invite you to take a look.

We have prepared beef, pork, and chicken during previous years, and discuss this with the requestor for the event. We have our own recipes, plus add to our repertoire through guests such as Pastor Zach Bauer (nationally-known smoker, Pastor, and author) and now Dr. Garcia. Some special

events from last year included the First Offenders Day Reporting Center (DRC) outings; Pastor Jake's installation; plus Pastor Rich's retirement event where we prepared beef tenderloin. It was all-hands-on-deck for that one.

For our Saturday smokes, we have a fellowship time after the meat is loaded into the smoker. So bring your lawn chair. We aim to respect your time, and be targeted



# New VIA de CRISTO Weekend Coming

April 18-21, 2024

A VIA de CRISTO weekend is three days in length, beginning on Thursday evening and ending the following Sunday evening. The participants live, study, worship and commune together daily. Fourteen talks are given, nine by lay people and five by clergy. Following each talk, small roundtable discussions focus on the main points of the talk and a poster is done. The talks, in an overlapping fashion, present the Christian life, based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. The titles of these talks indicate their content: Ideal, Piety, Study, Sacraments, Action, Obstacles to Grace, Leaders, Environment, Life in Grace, Christian Community, and Total Security. VIA de CRISTO gives those attending a living understanding of basic Christian Lutheran truths. Also, there is music and singing, food and fellowship, a time for laughter and for prayer.

Keep an open mind and heart in making your decision to attend VIA de CRISTO. Many of those who have attended wondered whether they should go. #### Stages of Marriage

hen I first heard about stages in marriage four were mentioned. I recently checked on-line, and we are up to eleven. This will deal with the four I know.

When first married the couple is infatuated with each other. "How was I so blessed that this wonderful creature chose to join with me in marriage?" You are absolutely certain you and your spouse will have

none of the difficulties you might have seen your parents or others experience.

But, one day you are saying to each other, "I had no idea you feel that way about..." We all grow up with "life commandments" from the home of our parents. A frequent example is whether you squeeze the toothpaste tube from the bottom or the middle. Two people who grew up in different households learned different ways. Now they are together under one roof and need to find their own common way. Not only are there ordinary differences, but you notice your spouse has actual faults. You may find some of your spouse's faults rude, hurtful, or embarrassing.

In the next phase you start your program to change and improve your spouse. There is a saying that men marry women hoping they never change, but they always do. And, women marry men hoping they will change, but they never do. People like to be accepted. They do not like to be someone's project to be changed and improved. The sweetness and mutual admiration so frequent in the early days of marriage disappear and may be replaced with feelings of rancor and loneliness. You may think you made a mistake and your true soulmate is out there somewhere. It is a good time to remember the love God describes in marriage is a selfless and giving kind of love that loves regardless of whether the one loved deserves it or is lovable.

Eventually, the two spouses give up on trying to change each other. Part of that may be a greater awareness of one's own faults. It is difficult to expect perfection from another when you more fully realize what it means that you are not perfect, either. Some of making peace with your spouse's faults may be a realization it is not his or her intent to be rude or to embarrass you. Perhaps you are being too sensitive and others do not consider your spouse's faults rude or embarrassing. Lowered expectations will help you a lot. Watch how your spouse's friends interact with your spouse. How are they able to enjoy your spouse's company despite things that make you crazy? Could it be those things are not the problem you see?

Finally comes what I call the old shoe phase. All of us have an old pair of shoes that are not much to look at. They may even have holes. Yet, they are incredibly comfortable and you would not trade them for any new pair. Make sure you stick around in your marriage for the old shoe phase.

#### Antibiotics Reduce Stomach Bleeding Caused by Aspirin

Ithough regular long-term aspirin use is recommended for some people to prevent heart attacks and strokes, it comes with the risk of stomach bleeding. Although rare, aspirin use can cause internal bleeding; by thinning the blood, it can make stomach ulcers bleed. A study published in "The Lancet" found that a short course on antibiotics can kill a type of bacteria called "Helicobacter pylori" (H. pylori) that causes stomach ulcers. Volunteers who tested positive for H. pylori were given either an antibiotic or a placebo. Although protection decreased with time, during the first two and one-half years, those who received antibiotics were less likely to be admitted to the hospital due to ulcer bleeds than those who took a placebo. Chris Hawley, professor of gastroenterology at the University of Nottingham in England said, "The findings of the study have shown that ulcer bleeding can be significantly reduced following one-week course of antibiotics."
